Meeting and Official Club Doings

The highlight of the December meeting was the appointment of a committee to review the bylaws and make recommendations. These recommendations will be reviewed on at the January meeting. The four committee members are Jim Fassino, Terry Beachler, Bob Wilson and George Knight. Also discussed was a restructuring of the dues requirements. Most notably, dropping the \$25 initiation fee and some breaks for <u>new members</u> joining later in the season. Following is an open letter by the new club president, Terry Beachler.

The January meeting is January 3, 2006, 7pm. Make a best effort to attend. Bylaws will be discussed. The Bylaws committee will report and propose many changes, mostly maintenance and housekeeping. Most of the work is to bring our Bylaws into conformance with the AMA guidelines. The dues are proposed to remain the same at \$100 per year with some breaks for new members and youth members. Also per AMA guidelines a section has been added for a grievance procedure, currently not included in the Bylaws. Revisions are proposed for the officer's positions. The Safety Coordinator (Sergeant at Arms) is regarded as a very important position with significant responsibilities. The responsibilities are more clearly stated in the proposed Bylaws. The committee is suggesting that the newsletter editor and nominating committee be appointed, again per AMA guidelines. As meeting attendance has been a problem, it is proposed that the requirement for a quorum be reduced from 30% to 20% of members. For bylaws changes, 50% of the members must be present and two thirds present must vote for the change. Without a quorum (30% of members) the Club cannot conduct routine business such as a proposal to have an air show. Without 18 members at a meeting and two thirds voting for, bylaws changes cannot happen, even something as simple as a dues reduction. Without a quorum (30% of members), the meetings are just a discussion. A final document will be posted on the web site and we intend to include it the January newsletter for approval at the February meeting.

Our survey which has had about a third of the club responding indicates no interest in having a "flying only" Club. There is wide interest in the various R/C activities. If you haven't completed the survey, fill it out and send it in. For the meetings, movies and show and tell are very popular. Skilled modelers listen up. We will knock on your door to be a presenter. We are listening. Results will be out in the January newsletter and I'll discuss the interim results at the meeting.

Does anyone have a good copy of the club logo or have the skill/interest/resources to either refresh ours or redo it? Let me know.

Michael Seyfert will be taking over the newsletter responsibility beginning with the January newsletter. If you have submissions, be sure to send them to him. Michael is a glider guy and will inundate us with stuff like drag buckets, best 1/d, Reynolds Numbers, and bungee launches. He is new at the newsletter stuff, so be sure to contribute and help him along.

On 12/28/2005 our lease was signed for 2006. If you think you need to fly on New Year's Day, feel free.
